## We Go the Extra Mile for Our Cats!

Cat Care Society prides itself on going the extra mile to make our cats the best cats to adopt. Of course, at times it does cost extra money to do so, but these little furry balls of love are worth it! The average cost per cat in our shelter is \$260, with an adoption rate of \$90, so obviously we don't "break even" when we place these cats up for adoption.

There are many stories of cats that have been brought into our shelter that we have had to do a little extra. I thought I would share a couple of stories of some of these cats.

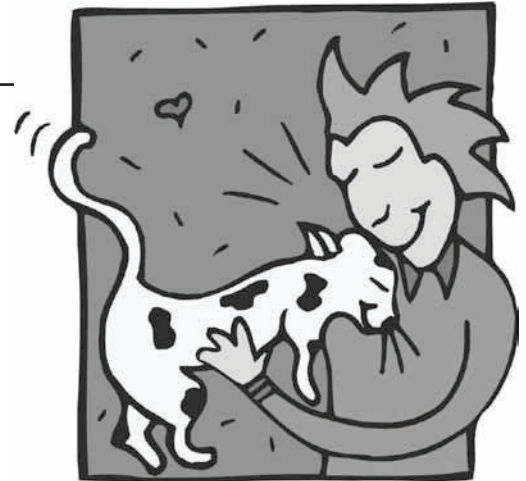
Commander Bam Bam was left at our doorstep in a box. After spending a few weeks in foster care at my house, where Daveeda fell-in-love with him, Bam Bam and his buddy Dino were brought back to the shelter for adoption. Because they were bigger kittens, we decided the best place for them to be would be in the hallway where there were other cats to play with and lots of room to run. One Sunday morning, the cleaning staff came in and found blood all over the floor! They immediately began searching for the bleeding cat. They finally found Bam Bam who was bleeding profusely from the mouth. Of course, on a Sunday, our Clinic is closed so they called Peggy Lyon, one of our Veterinary Technicians and she immediately drove Bam Bam to an emergency veterinary clinic. Bam Bam had to have some of his tongue removed and was in surgery for several hours. He then went back to foster care to recover from this ordeal. To say the least, emergency care was very expensive, but Bam Bam is now fully recovered and he and his buddy Dino are still waiting for the purr-fect family to take them home. Because we were never able to figure out what he did to his mouth, we have taken extra precautions to make sure there are not any sharp objects available for kittens eating pleasures!

Another instance where the staff went the extra mile was about a month ago, when an adorable tabby kitten, approximately 6 weeks old was brought to the shelter. This kitten was very charming and she had lots of energy. Prior to any cat or kitten being put in the shelter, they must have a full physical and testing for feline leukemia and feline aids, which are highly contagious diseases that Cat Care Society is not

equipped to deal with. Generally, these felines have to be euthanized. Unfortunately, this kittens tested positive for feline aids, but because she was so energetic and studies are now showing that some of these cats can live long, reasonably healthy lives, Abbi Collins, Connie Houseman and Suellen Scott started calling various shelters in the Denver metro area to see if they would be able to take this kitten. Fortunately, one of the animal shelters, who are equipped to handle these types of cats, was able to take the kitten.

We are happy to say that the kitten went to that shelter and was responding well. Cat Care Society can't guarantee that we can save all these cats and kittens with this disease, because space is limited in other shelters, but we felt good that this one has a chance for a good life!

I want to thank all the staff, volunteers and supporters because we wouldn't be able to help these cats without all of your support! 🐾

6. They don’t think anything is wrong with them – it is the rest of the world that walks funny!

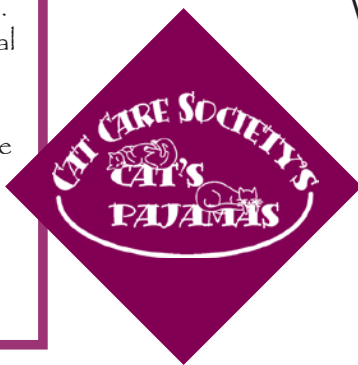
