The Cat Clinic Is Ready To Serve You and Your Feline Family!

Beginning in February 2016, we made big plans for the Cat Clinic at Cat Care Society—plans that mean an even wider array of treatments and surgeries, with newer, more efficient equipment. Our goal is to provide more care, for more cats, in a clinic setting that is both welcoming and attractive.



Our veterinary care team is in place! Katie Waisanen, MS/DVM, is our lead veterinarian (above left); Barbara Goodrich, DVM, is our part-time veterinarian (above right); Nikole Woods and Abigail Christman are our veterinary technicians, and Hillary Harman is our front desk/room assistant. This experienced Cat Clinic team offers exceptional care to our shelter cats as well as our clinic patients.

To provide the highest quality care for your feline family, we have expanded our veterinary services to include extended hours, in-house bloodwork, in-house urine culture testing, ultrasound testing and Royal Canin prescription food. And we are offering additional surgery options and dental procedures using our digital dental X-ray unit.

We continue to develop our vendor partnership with Royal Canin. We plan to begin selling Royal Canin feline adult and breed specific food starting in late December.

The Cat Clinic is now operating with extended hours including Saturdays and longer weekdays. On Saturdays we are

now open from 8:00am until 2:00pm. Tuesday through Friday appointments are available from 7:00am until 6:00pm. Our goal is to better serve you, our loyal and valued clients!

All of these enhancements and upgrades mean less outsourcing; more savings we can pass on to you; faster turnaround on imaging and tests; and most important, the highest quality veterinary care for your cat.

Take a moment to stop by the revamped waiting room of the Cat Clinic! We have updated our clinic with fresh paint, new furnishings, a feline themed mural and new artwork. We want every customer and patient entering the clinic to experience its warm, inviting and fear-free atmosphere.

The artwork on display is part of the Cat House Gallery, which hosts rotating artwork for sale in the Cat Clinic waiting area. Art shows will alternate every few months and include various themes. Best of all, 40% of the proceeds from art sales go to CCS, directly benefiting the cats. So far we have sold 25 paintings.



Our new show, The Creative Meow, has already begun – so please stop by to purchase your own whimsical feline art!

We have accomplished many of our important goals for the Cat Clinic since our last issue; and we couldn't have done it without you, our loyal and valued supporters.

The future continues to look bright for The Cat Clinic at Cat Care Society and we invite you to stop by the clinic so you can witness the positive changes and experience the warm and inviting atmosphere for yourself and your feline family. 🐾

Cat Care Society operates a cage-free shelter for homeless and abused cats that provides adoption, counseling, humane education, and community outreach services to enrich the lives of people and cats.



From Your Executive Director

Winter is here... and it's time to snuggle up with your favorite feline and read the latest installment of Cat Care Society's quarterly newsletter!

As we transition from fall to winter, we continue to celebrate the successes we have seen at Cat Care Society (CCS) in the last few months... all thanks to you, our dedicated and valued supporters!

I am overjoyed to share with all of you the progress we have made thus far with our 2016 goals:

- The Cat Clinic expansion is complete and offers expanded services, additional appointment times, updated equipment and a knowledgeable, dedicated staff.
- We continue to expand our community outreach programs and events which included: PrideFest, Denver County Fair, Uber Kittens, school/scout visits; Humane education programs and seminars; Perpet-U-Care program; temporary care program; Nibbles n' Kibbles Food Bank; and nursing home visits.
- Boost cat and kitten adoptions by 30% (from 340 to 510); we are at 65% of this goal with 327 adoptions.
- Increase cat and kitten intakes by 40% (from 383 to 536); we are at 67% of this goal with 355 intakes.
- Expand our foster care network by 40% (from 15 foster homes to 25); we have met 100% of this goal with 26 foster homes.
- Reintroduce our Nine Lives Legacy Society (estates/wills) and Nine Lives Guardianship Program (cats); and increase membership in the Nine Lives Partners Giving Club (monthly giving) by 25% (from 77 to 97); we have

achieved 118% of this goal and have a total of 116 members.

• Continue to expand our fundraising efforts:

- » In April, we exceeded our \$13,000 goal for the Cat Clinic Equipment Upgrade crowd-fund, raising a total of \$13,195.
- » In August, we exceeded our \$13,000 goal to raise funds for Rocky and Rigby's critical surgeries, raising a total of \$13,633.
- » We introduced a craft sale to Festival of Felines this year which was very successful. All handmade items were 100% donated to the shelter and we raised \$5,340! With the return of Painted Cats in 2017, we will continue with our Festival of Felines event showcasing both the painted cats and our craft sale.
- » Our donor appreciation event for major contributors was well attended and offered a special viewing of the completed Sue Sioux Painted Cat and the drawings of the final 2017 Painted Cats.
- » Our Santa Paws Festival was a huge success this year raising \$15,625.
- » Our Colorado Gives Day campaign brought the highest success overall, where we raised a total of \$65,625!

The Cat Care Society is growing and changing like never before. Already in 2016 we've found forever homes for more than 327 cats and kittens including seniors and special needs cats Barney and Chase, our first FIV-positive cat. With your continued support, CCS is poised to continue its growth and development as we rescue, medically treat and adopt many more felines in need.

All of us in the CCS family - donors, volunteers, board members and staff members - are committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for our cats; and with your help we can continue this important work.

As always, we thank you for your continued generosity and support of our cats and our mission.

Over the past few years these talented and creative individuals have donated hours upon hours of service including feeding many cats, scooping hundreds of boxes, staffing the Nibbles & Kibbles Food Bank, working events, helping to adopt out the cats and making all the shelter residents feel loved while they wait for their forever homes. And now the TOPC fundraiser in 2017 will benefit from their amazing talent too! Cat Care is very fortunate and appreciative for the time and skills they will put into this project, thanks to their love of art and cats.

Where Are They Now? *Another Good Outcome for a CCS Cat*

The happy ending stories keep unfolding at the Cat Care Society, and we love to share them with you—because **thanks to the generosity of supporters like you**, we have been able to give hundreds of cats a second chance at a life of quality, in a permanent loving home. One of our most recent success stories is about a cat named Dagwood, the handsome orange and white tabby pictured here.



This is really a story about *multiple* “second chances.”

Dagwood has had a long and sometimes stressful life, returning to CCS several times. But we have

always been here for him, never giving up on finding the right new home for him.

A kind woman from Aurora first brought Dagwood to CCS in March of 2003. He was a stray, living outside; after she fed him for a couple of months, he came into her house, and eventually started sleeping in her bed! She described him to CCS as a very friendly cat that loves to be held (which is still true to this day). Our veterinarian estimated his age at six years and pronounced him healthy.

Not long after his seven-day lost-and-found hold expired, Dagwood went home to live with a woman and her eleven-year-old son who had visited the shelter often. During our two-week follow-up call, the mom reported that he was friends with the other cat in the home and was doing well. But many changes came to this household, Dagwood developed anxieties, and the family could no longer care for him. He was returned to CCS in July of 2005.

That September, CCS took him along when we had a booth at *A Taste of Colorado*. There he was adopted and taken to a home with a female cat a year younger than Dagwood. His new mom described him as very cuddly, and he loved the female cat. But he had problems adjusting and soon started howling during the day. Then he started playing too roughly with the female cat, and he became

needy. He was playful with children, but he had to be the center of attention and wanted to be held all the time. After nine months in his third home, this family also returned Dagwood to our shelter.

He was talkative and loved attention from staff and visitors. In October of 2006, Dagwood was adopted once again, by an elderly woman with a cat a few years younger than Dagwood. (We made the adopter aware of his neediness and aggression towards some other cats.) Sadly, this adoption lasted only thirteen days. His needi-

ness was so great that the other cat had begun to feel neglected.

So once more Dagwood came back to the shelter. This time he was with us only eight days—and this time he found a long-term home, where he was the only pet. No competition for affection! The staff’s follow-up inquiry revealed that he was not scared or shy in his new home; he loved to play and was eating well. Dagwood was in this happy home for almost 10 years.

Because he was now a senior, Dagwood was eligible for CCS’s Perpet-U-Care program, receiving up to \$250.00 worth of veterinary care in our clinic each year. He was a regular patient in our Cat Clinic.

In December of 2015, the clinic diagnosed Dagwood as having renal disease. He was in his home another two months, but his aging guardian could no lon-



ger care for him. In February of 2016 Dagwood came back, once again, to CCS.

He was now 19 years old; he wasn’t eating well and weighed less than eight pounds. Our vet techs gave him IV fluids and put him on a prescription renal diet. Despite his ailments, he never missed an opportunity to get in someone’s lap. Our volunteer socializers helped to calm him and provide the attention he still craved. It looked like he might just live out his days in the CCS shelter.

But then in walked a couple who couldn’t resist his charms. Their 18-year-old cat had recently passed away; they had two males, aged eleven and five, that get along with each other. Our adoption staff disclosed Dagwood’s full history, advising them that Dagwood really should be an only cat. But Gerry and Tara were sure he would be a good fit with their two “very mellow” cats in their large mountain home.

A recent follow-up by CCS staff reveals that things got off to a rocky start, with Dagwood acting possessive of his new humans and being aggressive, just as we feared, toward the other cats. But

Tara and Gerry were determined to find a peaceful solution. So they moved him into their home office, a room he really liked, where Gerry writes at night. Now Dagwood has Gerry all to himself! (Dagwood has never lived with a man before.) He has a large cat-condo tower that looks out on the woods; he spends his days watching the forest animals.

When they are home and can supervise Dagwood, he comes out and joins his new brothers, and they have some family time. Living in a home with two humans affords Dagwood the attention he desperately needs; and having his own room seems to keep his stress level down, reducing the competitiveness he feels towards the other cats.

Dagwood is finally in his forever home, where he will be loved and cared for all the rest of his days.

Clearly this is more than a second-chance story: CCS saw to it that Dagwood had third, fourth and fifth chances. **We are committed to the cats that come to us.** You may have noticed the follow-up we do after every adoption—and that CCS will **always** accept the return of any cat adopted from our shelter....and will keep giving the cat all the loving attention and veterinary care that it needs.

But we couldn't give these cats that level of care without your support. We are so grateful to our donors for helping the Cat

Care Society take in and care for little guys like Dagwood...and get them ready to go home with their ideal family like Dagwood did. But there are so many more cats like Dagwood, in need of the second-chance benefits of shelter, state-of-the-art veterinary care, and adoption into a loving home. Since **we receive no government funding**, all of our support comes from the community—generous people like you, who love cats. Can you help us now, with a gift of financial assistance to CCS?

- \$100 covers two weeks' worth of antibiotics for five sick cats.

King Soopers Continues Its Support of CCS

As of the end of November 2016, we had received \$38,518 from King Soopers since we started participating in their Gift Card program!

The Cat Care Society fundraiser through the use of King Soopers Reloadable Gift Cards is still going strong because of supporters like you. The CCS resident cats are so grateful to have your continued support. **We now receive an average of \$670 a month under this program—enough to pay for ten spays and ten neuter surgeries in our Cat Clinic!**

If you still haven't gotten one, please consider helping CCS by using one. It's so easy to do:

#1 Purchase the King Soopers Gift Card from Cat Care Society at our front desk. It costs \$25 and

has \$25 of credit on the card.

#2 Either you or the gift recipient can take the card to King Soopers; and either at the Customer Service Desk or before paying for the groceries, add any amount to the card to increase its value, from \$2.50 to \$500. Then use the gift card to cover the cost of the groceries.

#3 Cat Care Society wins too! King Soopers donates 5% of the value of the groceries bought each month, to CCS. Again, none of the donation comes from your pocket. Just buy your groceries as usual and pay for them using the CCS Reloadable King Soopers Gift Card.

#4 When you use up the money on the Gift Card, you just reload more. You may pay for reloading the card by cash, check, debit or credit card.



The CCS KS Gift Card may be used at King Soopers or City Market, including their Fueling Centers. Nibbles ‘n’ Kibbles Food Bank
CCS offers free cat food and litter for Jefferson County, CO, residents who are temporarily unable to provide food and litter to their cats. This helps prevent abuse, neglect, or abandonment of cats when their owners encounter temporary hard times.
