How to build a Feeding Station

For a Feral Cat Colony





Supplies Needed



- 30 gallon or 20 gallon storage container with lid.
 - we used a 30 gallon sterilite
- a box cutter
- a rock or other large object to keep shelter from blowing away.
- a drill (optional)
 - this makes cutting the door easier
- a sharpie
- measuring tape

Instructions


Step One:

Flip over the storage container so the lid is on the ground.




Step Two:

Measure out a door that is
6 inches by 6 inches.
Place the door closer to
one side of the storage container like
the picture below.



Step Three: (optional)

Take your drill and drill four holes in the corners of the door.




Instructions Continued


Step Four:

Take the box cutter and start at one of the corners of your stenciled door. If you drilled holes start out one of those holes.

Poke your box cutter into the corner and drag it down cutting the door out of the stencil.

Restart at each corner or hole until each side is complete.





Instructions Continued

Step Five:

Take your feeding station outside to where you plan to place it.

The best place for feeding stations are in the least busiest area or just where you normally feed.

Lift the storage container and place your bowls on the other side of where you cut out the door.



Instructions Continued

Step Six:

Finally, place a rock, weight, or heavy object on top of your feeding station.

This will help keep it in place.
